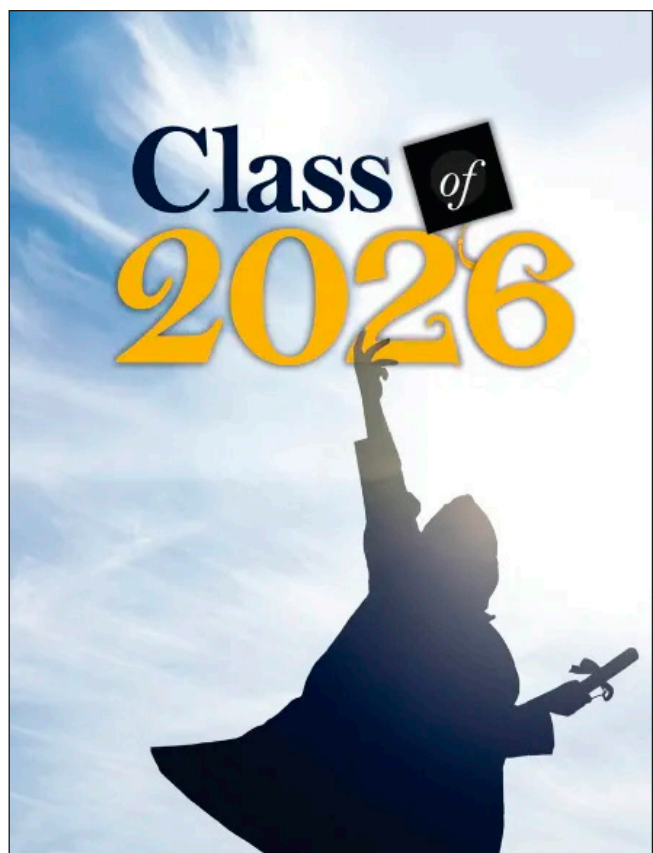


### Pie a teacher in the face!

## High School Summer Theater Workshop

Lovewell Workshops is looking for creative high school students! In-person high school theater workshops offered by the Lovewell Institute for the Creative Arts and the Dane G. Hansen Foundation are returning this summer.

The week-long day camp/workshop brings students from all different creative backgrounds together to create an original work of musical theater from scratch. ### Repairs to start on Hall Street bridge over I-70

Work is expected to begin on May 26 on a Kansas Department of Transportation project to repair the bridge carrying Hall Street over I-70 near Hays in Ellis County.

Project work will include deck patching, substructure concrete surface repair, drip edge repair and bridge deck overlay. Traffic will be reduced to one lane through the work zone and directed by temporary traffic signals. An 11-foot width restriction will also be in place during construction. Motorists should plan for minor delays, not exceeding 5 minutes.

KDOT expects work to be completed in early August, conditions permitting.

PCIRoads, of St. Michael, Minnesota, is the primary contractor for the \$185,000 project. KDOT urges motorists to stay alert and follow posted signs in all work zones. ## Ringneck Golf Claims Regional Title and qualifies for State

Due to severe weather, the Hill City High School Ringnecks had to wait an extra day at Cedar Hills Golf Course south of Washington to claim the regional 1A title with a team score of 366. Scheduled for Monday, May 18, the tournament did not start until Tuesday. The team traveled to the area on Sunday to get a practice round in and completed another practice round on Monday. The Ringnecks were champions over the second-place team of Onaga by 32 strokes. Hill City had five players in the top 11 performances.

AJ Deges finished in fourth place with a final score of 81. Kenley Gugleman had a score of 83, placing 5th, while Tate Balthazor tied for 6th after shooting an 84. In 9th place was Case Haynes with an 86 and Chase Bell at 11th with a scorecard finish of 86. Mitchell Presley finished out the Ringneck scoring at 103.

Lost Spring-Centre's Easton Glesner finished first overall (74), Bishop Seabury's, Jace Hoffman (78) was 2nd and Onaga's Graham Valburg (78) third.

Cedar Hills played at 5936 yards from the white/black tee boxes on an unusually cool day in north central Kansas.

#### A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PROVISION OF WATER FREE OF COST FOR USD 281 LONGFELLOW MIDDLE SCHOOL PROPERTY:

WHEREAS, the City of Hill City provides water service for USD 281, including at the LongFellow Middle School property, located at 203 N. 2nd Street;

WHEREAS, the Graham County Community Garden has been using the LongFellow Middle School property to provide community members with opportunities to grow vegetables at no cost and increase access to fresh, healthy produce in the community;

WHEREAS, the City of Hill City has been providing water to USD 281 for the Graham County Community Garden through the water service at LongFellow Middle School property at no cost to either USD 281 or to the Graham County Community Garden; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hill City agrees to continue providing water to USD 281 for the Graham County Community Garden through the water service at the LongFellow Middle School property at no cost to either USD 281 or the Graham County Community Garden until July 2031.

#### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF HILL CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The Governing Body of the City of Hill City adopts the above recitals as their findings.

SECTION 2: The Governing Body of the City of Hill City will continue to provide water to USD 281 for the Graham County Community Garden through the water service at LongFellow Middle School property at no cost to either USD 281 or to the Graham County Community Garden until July 2031.

SECTION 3: This resolution shall be in full force and effect from its adoption.

## Insight - Kansas Farm Bureau - opinion Opening gates

Another school year has wrapped up for my children and summer on the farm has officially begun. My husband and I saw major growth in both of our kids this year personally, academically and athletically.

We saw our kids experience successes in their classrooms, perform in concerts, march in parades, discover new activities of interest, build friendships and saw how consistent hard work during practices pays off during competition.

It was a fantastic school year for both children, and I'm thankful that my husband and I were able to see and experience so much of it together with them even though that wasn't what we had planned for at the start of the school year.

We had not planned for my husband to attend the majority of my son's football games this year given our typical fall farming demand and schedule. Instead, we had planned for his presence during winter events when the farming schedule is generally calmer than in the fall, spring and summer.

We figured that he'd be watching a number of the games online from the cab of a tractor or combine. But because of an incredibly wet fall, which kept everyone in our area out of the fields for extended periods of time, my husband got to sit in the bleachers of every home game and all but one of the away games this fall.

The unusually wet fall also allowed my husband to join me for other school activi-

ties like watching our daughter participate in a special concert with other students from schools throughout our region. I don't think any of us expected to see my husband at so many of the kids' school activities, but it's safe to say that we were all thankful he could.

Following a winter of attending a lot of basketball games, my husband and I again prepared for a typical spring farming schedule that would prevent my husband from attending the majority of our kids' activities.

However, now a lack of rain has allowed my husband to attend every single track and field meet this spring. It's been too dry to get everything planted. We've been waiting for the spring rains that have simply not come.

An unusual year of weather gave our family the precious gift of presence we didn't plan for. But what this atypical weather means for a summer wheat harvest, haying season and getting our fall crops in the ground is something that continues to concern us.

Over the years, I've learned many lessons about being a farm family. This year has reiterated that we are not in control and all we can really do is make adjustments based on what the season presents. We also have to recognize the gifts we are given and continue to fervently pray for rain.
